I. SUBJECT MATTER AND DATE

The 16th Raj Anand Moot Court Competition is based on intellectual property and competition law. The Competition will be held on August 25, 2018.

II. LANGUAGE

The language of the competition shall be English.

III. ELIGIBILITY

The competition is open for students who belong to teams that have been invited by the organizers.

The participants should be currently pursuing their Bachelors' degree in law i.e. 3- years LL.B. Program or the 5-year B.A., LL.B./ B.B.A., LL.B/ BSc. L.L.B Programme.

IV. TEAM COMPOSITION

The teams should consist of precisely two oralists and one researcher. In a particular round, only two oralists are permitted to address arguments.

The researchers are not allowed to speak unless a question is specifically posed to him/her by the Presiding Bench.

The team composition must be communicated to the organizers by email no later than by **11:59 p.m. on August 20, 2018.**

V. MEMORIAL

A. Submission Deadline and Formatting requirements

The following requirements for memorials must be strictly followed. Non-conformities will be penalized:

- The teams must prepare separate memorials on behalf of the Informant and Opposite Party.
- The teams must e-mail the final memorials for both sides to the organizers to mootcourt@anandandanand.com by **11.59 P.M. on August 9, 2018** in MS WORD only.
- 10 copies of the memorials **for each side** must reach the organizers by the **August 20, 2018, latest by 5.00 P.M.**
- Once the memorials are submitted, the teams will not be allowed to make any amendments to the same.
- The memorials must be
 - On A4 Size Paper

- Bookman Old Style, Size 14
 - 2 line spacing
 - A margin measuring one inch on all sides of each page.
 - Page numbering should be at the bottom center of each page.
- The memorials must be spiral bound.
 - The memorials **must not** mention the name of your institution or identify the participating college or student in any manner. Teams are required to only mention the team code provided on the top right hand corner of the cover page.
 - The memorial must necessarily contain the following sections and must be restricted as stated below:

Table of contents	One Page
Index of authorities	Not exceeding six pages
Statement of jurisdiction	One Page
Statement of facts	One Page
Statement of issues	One Page
Summary of arguments	One Page
Arguments advanced	1500 words (excluding footnotes)
Prayer	One Page

- No additional facts may be incorporated or relied upon other than those stated in the problem.
- The teams are advised to use The Harvard Blue Book Style of footnoting as far as practicable. In any case, footnoting styles must be consistent throughout the memorial.
- Footnotes must be restricted to providing bare citations, and must not be accompanied by any form of description or explanation of the authority relied upon.

- Bookman Old Style, Size 10
- 1.0 line spacing
- The Cover page of the Memorials must be **Blue** for the Informant and **Red** for Opposite Party. The cover page of the memorial must state the following:
 - Title stating that the same is a memorial of the Informant or the Opposite Party, as the case may be.
 - The cause title.
 - The team code on the top right corner.

B. Scoring of Memorials:

The criteria for marking the memorials are:

- Application and appreciation of facts (10 points)
- Identification and presentation of issues (30 points)
- Application of legal principles (30 points)
- Use of authorities and precedents (10 points)
- Logical structuring, Grammar & Style (15 points)
- Consistent footnoting & formatting (5 points)

VI. ORAL ROUNDS

A. Format of Rounds

Preliminary Round

- There will be a preliminary round of arguments where each team will be given the opportunity to argue on behalf of either the Informant or the Opposite Party. There will be a draw of lots to identify which side the team will represent in the preliminary round.
- In the preliminary round, each team will get a total of 30 minutes to present their case.
- In the preliminary round, the division of time is at the discretion of the team members, subject to a maximum of 17 minutes per oralist.

- In the preliminary round, the division of time must be communicated by one researcher of each competing team to the time keeper/ bailiff prior to the commencement of each round. In case no such communication is made, the oralists will have 15 minutes each.
- In addition, each team will be given 5 minutes for Rebuttal and Sur-rebuttal (optional).
- The oral arguments should be confined to the issues presented in the memorials.
- The researcher may sit with the oralists at the time of the orals.
- The top 4 teams with the highest points will progress to the next round (Semi-Finals). In case of a tie even in the number of points, the team with highest oralist score will progress.

Semi-Final Round (Knock Out)

- The top four teams will proceed to Semi-Finals.
 - Team 1 will face Team 4.
 - Team 2 will face Team 3.
- The teams will pick lots prior to the semi-final round which will decide which side they are arguing for.
- In the Semi-Final Round, each team will get a total of 40 minutes to present their case.
- In the Semi-Final Round and the Final Round, the division of time is at the discretion of the team members, subject to a maximum of 22 minutes per Oralist.
- In the Semi-Final Round, the division of time must be communicated by the Researcher of each competing team to the Time Keeper/ Bailiff prior to the commencement of each round. In case no such communication is made, the Oralists will have 20 minutes each.
- In addition, each team will be given 5 minutes for Rebuttal and Sur-rebuttal (optional).
- The oral arguments should be confined to the issues presented in the memorials.
- The researchers may sit with the Oralists at the time of the orals.
- The winning teams will progress to the Final Round.

Final Round

- The teams that progress will pick lots in order to decide which side they will argue for. The timing for the said lots will be announced immediately after the declaration of the results of the Semi-Final Rounds.
- In the Final Round, each team will get a total of 45 minutes to present their case.
- In the Final Round, the division of time is at the discretion of the team members, subject to a maximum of 27 minutes per Oralist.
- In the Final Round, the division of time must be communicated by the Researcher of each competing team to the Time Keeper/ Bailiff prior to the commencement of each round. In case no such communication is made, the Oralists will have 22 ½ minutes each.
- In addition, each team will be given 5 minutes for Rebuttal and Sur-rebuttal (optional).
- The oral arguments should be confined to the issues presented in the memorials.
- The researcher may sit with the Oralists at the time of the orals.

B. Scoring of Oral Rounds

The team score for each round will be **(Cumulative Score of Oralist 1) + (Cumulative score of Oralist 2) + (Halved Memorial Score of team for the side represented).**

Each oralist will be marked by each Judge in each round on the following criteria:

- Knowledge of law (20)
- Application of Law to Facts (20)
- Ingenuity and ability to answer to questions (20)
- Style, Poise, Courtesy and Demeanour (20)
- Time Management (10)
- Organization (10)

C. Exchange of Memorials

- Prior to each round, the organizers will arrange for the exchange of memorials.
- The teams are prohibited from making any marks on the exchanged memorials
- The teams are prohibited from making any copies of the memorials which have been thus exchanged.
- The teams are required to return the exchanged memorials to the Court Officers of the respective round.

VII. PENALTIES

Penalties in relation to the Memorials shall be communicated to the teams prior to the commencement of the Preliminary Rounds on Day 1.

Incorrect/Inconsistent Font Size	2 points (one time penalty)
Improper Line Spacing	
Failure to include all Sections in the Memorial as prescribed	
Incorrect Paper Size	
Exceeding Word Count	Between 1500-1600: 2 points (with 1 point deducted for every additional 100 words thereafter, subject to a maximum of 8 points as penalty)
Failure to include necessary information on the cover of the memorial	2 points
Any form of identification of the institution or members of the participating team other than as prescribed	Can incur disqualification or a maximum of 20 points subject to the discretion of the organizers
Delayed submission of soft copy of the memorial	3 points
Delayed receipt of the hard copies of the memorials	2 points
Delay in arriving for the oral rounds	3 points (for each delayed appearance at each round)

Any attempt to contact the organizers or the Judges prior to the Moot Court Competition to illicit information or seek help	Can incur disqualification or a maximum of 20 points subject to the discretion of the organizers
Scouting: Other than the rounds in which the team is participating, no member of any team will be allowed to observe the Oral Rounds or read the Memorial of any other team.	Can incur disqualification or a maximum of 20 points subject to the discretion of the organizers

VIII. AWARDS

- Best Oralist Award- a cash prize of Rs.10,000/- only.
- Best Memorial Award- a cash prize of Rs.10,000/- only.
- Best Team Award is a rolling Trophy; a cash prize of Rs.25,000/- only and 1 month internship with Anand and Anand for all 3 team members.
- Second Best Team will be given a cash prize of Rs.15,000/- only.

THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES AND ORGANISERS IS FINAL.
